## R14: National framework

## Purpose of collecting these data:

The module aims at collecting information on the national legal and programmatic framework that underpins the national response to the drug problem. This includes the national drug strategies, systems for monitoring the drug situation, national coordinating systems on legal provisions to place substances under national control and other related matters. This information allows for an understanding of the legal and policy framework in which the country operates, and acts as metadata for the data collected in other modules. Given the slow nature of the changes that tend to occur in national systems, legal provisions and policy documents that are the main subject of this module, this information is to be collected at a lower frequency than other rotating modules.

The module includes qualitative information on how national systems relevant to address the drug problem work, including systems related to criminal justice, treatment, prevention, extradition, combating money laundering, access to internationally controlled medications, and monitoring systems.
